

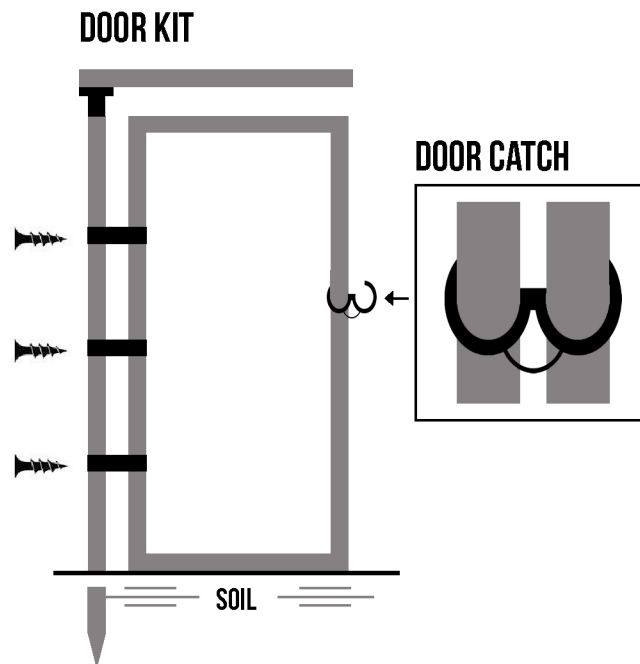
STANDARD DOOR KIT

PLEASE NOTE: A mallet is usually required to tap the joiners into the tubes. Please ensure the joiners are fully submerged into the aluminium.

DOOR CONTENTS

2	ALUMINIUM TUBING 1.854M
2	ALUMINIUM TUBING 750MM
1	ALUMINIUM TUBING 2.2M
1	LARGE ANCHOR

1	DOOR CATCH
3	DOOR HINGE JOINT
4	DOOR JOINER CORNER
1	UPRIGHT TUBE CLIP
3	SELF-TAPPING SCREWS



(Build the door)

Slide the 3 hinges onto one of the 1.85m tubes.

Join the 2 x 750mm & 2 x 1.85m tubes with the door corners, creating the frame.

Slide the open side of the hinges onto the 2.2m upright tube. Tap in the 'self-tapping' screws on this side to stop the hinges from moving. Push the Y connector into the top of the 2.2m tube.

(Fit the door)

The door can be fitted anywhere on the cage but must be positioned so that the right-hand side (if you are stood outside the cage) is next to an upright (2.2m pole) to enable the door catch to be fitted.

Push the remaining ground anchor into the ground around approx. 800mm from the upright.

Take the 2.2m pole with the Y connector (this will have the door frame attached to it also) and push it up onto the crossbar, slotting it into the anchor at the same time.

Take the door catch and push onto the two poles.

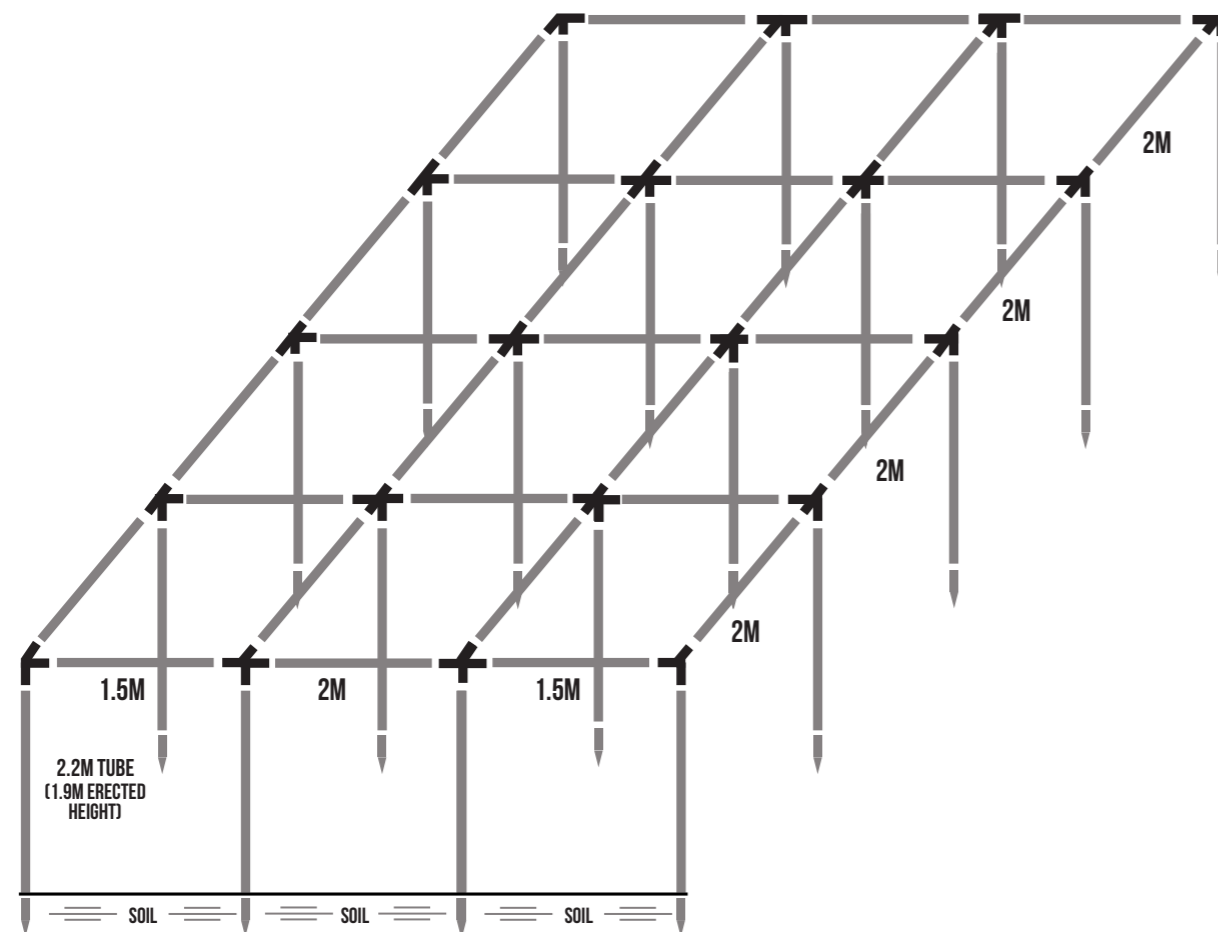

STANDARD LARGE CAGE (W) 5M X (L) 8M

PLEASE NOTE: A mallet is usually required to tap the joiners into the tubes. Please ensure the joiners are fully submerged into the aluminium.

ASSEMBLY PROCESS

STEP 1: Ensure that the area where you are going to put the cage is flat and level. Mark out the 4 corners of the cage, ideally with string-lines. Taking this extra time at this point will save time with the cage erection.

STEP 2: (Build the door)

Slide the 3 hinges onto one of the 1.85m tubes. Join the 2 x 750mm & 2 x 1.85m tubes with the door corners, creating the frame. Slide the open side of the hinges onto the 2.2m upright tube. Tap in the 'self-tapping' screws on this side to stop the hinges from moving. Push the Y connector into the top of the 2.2m tube.

STEP 3: (Build the cage a section at a time)

Mallet the pointed anchors into the ground, leaving ½ inch still visible. If you do not have a mallet, use a hammer and piece of wood.

STEP 4: Push the joiners into the upright (2.2m) poles as per diagram (they may need a little tap with the mallet) Slot the 2.2m uprights into the ground anchors ensuring that the poles are upright and level. Put the crossbars in section by section as per diagram, checking with the spirit level that the poles are upright and level.

STEP 5: (Fit the door)

The door can be fitted anywhere on the cage but must be positioned so that the right-hand side (if you are stood outside the cage) is next to an upright (2.2m pole) to enable the door catch to be fitted. Then connect the Y joiner to the crossbar above the door.

STEP 6: Push the remaining ground anchor into the ground around approx. 800mm from the upright. Take the 2.2m pole with the Y connector (this will have the door frame attached to it also) and push it up onto the crossbar, slotting it into the anchor at the same time. Take the door catch and push onto the two poles.

(If ordered with cover)

To attach the netting, take the 'side' netting and start at the upright with the door catch on: secure the netting with cable ties (4 per upright) and one every 0.5m along the top. Ensure that the netting is pulled taught between the poles. When you reach the door you can either run the netting over the door and secure or cut the netting and cover the door on its own. The 'roof' netting needs to be pulled out to its full width then laid over the top of the cage and secured with the net clips linking through both nettings.

(Please Note: If due heavy forecast of snow please remove roof netting beforehand.)
